

New Training Requirements for All DEA-Registered Providers

Overview

Congress eliminated the DATA-Waiver program for prescribing buprenorphine as part of the <u>Consolidated Appropriations Act</u> on December 29, 2022.¹ As a follow-up to these changes, <u>new</u> training requirements for *all* prescribers will go into effect in June.²

Starting on June 27, 2023, the process for DEA license registration or renewal will require *all* prescribers to check a box confirming they have completed at least 8 hours of training specific to management of patients with opioid use disorder.

There are three ways to meet this requirement:

1. Board certification in Addiction Psychiatry or Addiction Medicine by the ABMS, ABAM, or AOA.

-or-

2. Graduation from an accredited medical residency, dental school, physician assistant, or advanced practice nursing program on or after June 27, 2018.

-or-

3. Completion of 8 hours of training provided by an approved organization. Training only has to be completed once in a career. Prior training counts toward the requirement.

If you need a training course to meet the new DEA requirements, many options are available. For example, the <u>Providers Clinical Support System</u> (funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration within the US Department of Health and Human Services) has convenient, free, in-person or remote sessions, as well as modules for self-study at your own pace.³
